This happened on his last game of the evening. Even more impressive about Simpson's game was that he has been bowling recently with his pinky and ring finger, instead of the customary middle and ring fingers, due to injury. This was Simpson's seventeenth perfect game in Richmond.

In other local bowling news, the Madison County Bowling Association just held its Annual Holiday Tournament this past Sunday. Fifty-two bowlers attended the event, and fun was had by all. John Conn bowled an 811 series in this no-tap format to finish as the top score for the men, and Matt Joyce came in second with a 796 score. The winner for the women was Narita Rose, who bowled a 744 series, while Miranda Joyce came in second for the women with a 716.

Monday Galaxy Seniors:

The top men's games for the week were all very close, with five men exceeding a 230 game. In the end, it was Richard Monholle finishing as the best game of the week with a 247, followed closely by Emory McNew with 246 and Donnie O'bryan at 235. Monholle also rolled the top series of the week for the men with a 697. McNew had the second-high series of 646 and Donny O'Bryan claimed the third spot with a 613 series.

For the women of this league, Shirley Bentley bowled a 203 game to finish first for the week, followed by Donna Schultz at 178 and Pam Bennett's 166. Bentley also finished the week with the best series of 516, Schultz had a 453 and Bennett rolled 445.

Monday Night Galaxy Classic:

Once again, the leading scores of this league were high, with ten men exceeding a 250 game. As stated in the opening of this article, Lucas Combs rolled the high game of the week with a perfect 300, also tied for high among all leagues for the week. Daniel Benge had the next highest game of 279. Johnny L. Johnson, Bobby Abrams and Tyler Morgan tied for third with a 268. This league has ended bowling for the first half of the year. Bobby Abrams, Lynn Estes and Anthony Newland ended the first half season in this no-tap league tied for the best game of 300. David Robinson had the second-highest game of the half with 290. The best men's series of the first half was also bowled by Estes at 814, and Abrams rolled the second -best series of 796.

For the women, April Brumfield rolled the best game of 230 and series of 629 for the first half of the season.

Wednesday Night Wednesday Wonders:

This league was very close for the top spots, with eight men exceeding a 250 game. As stated in the article opening, Troy Conner led the league with a perfect 300 game.
